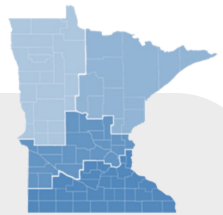
Legal Aid is Statewide. Provides civil legal help to low-income Minnesotans in all 87 counties.

Free Legal Help. Provides free advice, consultation, and/or full representation.

Eligibility Based on Income and Household Size. Most legal aid organizations have an eligibility criteria of 200% or below of the [Federal Poverty Guidelines](#).

Coordinated Intake. Call just one number—**1-877-MY-MN-LAW** (1-877-696-6529)—and talk with someone to see if you're eligible for help from one of many legal aid organizations.
