
Legal Aid is Statewide. Provides civil legal help to low-income Minnesotans in all 87 counties.

Free Legal Help. Provides free advice, consultation, and/or full representation.

**Eligibility Based on Income and Household Size.** Most legal aid organizations have an eligibility criteria of 200% or below of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

**Coordinated Intake**. Call just one number—**1-877-MY-MN-LAW** (1-877-696-6529)—and talk with someone to see if you're eligible for help from one of many legal aid organizations.

## How to Find and Connect with Help

<u>LawHelpMN.org</u>: Find information, resources, a lawyer, providers, and clinics. Complete DIY legal forms and download fact sheets with information about legal rights.

MNLegalAdvice.org: Post questions and get free civil legal advice from lawyers.

**Legal Kiosks**: Computers stationed throughout the state that provide access to legal aid. Apply for legal aid services, access legal resources, attend online meetings and court hearings.

<u>Justice Buses</u>: Mobile legal aid offices that travel to rural areas for events and general legal help.
